#### A Message from Georgetown Tourism

Explore over two dozen unique local eateries, especially our 12 downtown gems and shops, boutiques, art galleries, and antique mall, and enjoy the charm of our well-preserved Victorian downtown area. #### What the Bluegrass Cycling Club Does with Horsey Hundred Proceeds

The Horsey Hundred is the largest fundraising event for the Bluegrass Cycling Club (BCC). Proceeds from the ride support the BCC and our club activities throughout the year, but most of the funds are used to give back to the community. We do this through a variety of events and outreach initiatives.

#### **Pedaling for a Purpose**

Pedaling for a Purpose (P4P), now in its 9<sup>th</sup> year, is a wonderful collaboration between the BCC and West 6<sup>th</sup> Brewing in Lexington, KY. Pedaling for a Purpose combines education, bike rides, and philanthropy – three things the BCC is all about. We have 9 sessions beginning in April and ending in September hosted on Saturdays out of West 6thBrewing. We begin with a 45-minute education session with a different presenter every session, followed by bike rides. We select 3-4 cycling related organizations each year, and each mile riders log on P4P day (either in a group or individually) earns \$0.40 for our organization of the day (up to a total of \$1,400 per organization per year). Cyclists earn 1 point for each education session they attend, and 1 point for each ride they do on a P4P day and those earning enough points get a free jersey. This year we are supporting our 4 local NICA teams (youth mountain biking) AMBUCS, an organization that provides adaptive bikes to kids who need special accommodations, and Broke Spoke, our local community bike shop.

#### **Philanthropy Committee Initiatives**

The Bluegrass Cycling Club continues to look for ways to contribute to our communities and promote cycling and related activities:

- This year we were able to provide funds for the second year in a row to buy 200 helmets for the Georgetown Parks and Rec Derby Bike giveaway event.
- We also had several new funding activities:
  - We purchased a bike rack, helmets and 12 house bikes for the Lexington Rescue Mission, which serves formerly unhoused people, for their 4 transitional homes.
  - We donated a fleet of bikes to Breckinridge Elementary students. Children qualified for a bike by their teachers asking them to write an essay about why they want a bike.
  - We bought 4 new mountain bikes for the Boy Scout camp, Camp McKee. These bikes will benefit boy scouts in earning a merit badge and Eagle Scout.
  - We also provided a special grant to fund various activities and tools at our local community bike shop, Broke Spoke.

The BCC has for many years participated in holiday events near the end of the year and 2023 was no exception. We were able to provide Big Brothers/Big Sisters funds for helmets and bikes for their Christmas bike giveaway. We continue to support the Georgetown annual police Christmas party for elementary children. We provided over 20 bikes and helmets to children who were identified by the school and administrators.

So far this year we've awarded the new urban Town Branch Park a large grant to fund all the bicycle racks for the park.

## **Local Bike Shop Information**

We strongly recommend that you thoroughly check your bike to make sure it is in good working order before you get to the Horsey Hundred so that you can just enjoy the ride. However, we know things can and do happen unexpectedly. We will have several bike shops on campus with supplies to sell and to provide some mechanical support before and during the ride. Below is a list of local bike shops in case you need them. And even if you don't "need" anything we encourage you to visit them. Local bike shops are essential, and who doesn't like visiting a bike shop? All listed shops are in Lexington.
